

From Our Pastor

As we have done for many years, we will be distributing the annual “All In” Report to our parishioners next weekend. You will receive the report via email, and Jason Castelluccio, finance committee chair, will speak (via video) at all the Masses on the highlights. (There will be limited copies in print.)

I, the Staff and the Finance Council provide this report not only by obligation but in order to convey to you the status of our parish ministries and finances, and for engaged reviewing of it by you, our parishioners. It is important for the parish to chronicle and report back to parishioners our progress with various programs and ministries.

While reporting on our financial status is important, I also see this information as an exercise in stewardship since it provides how we as a parish have dedicated our time, our talent, and our treasure, the financial resources of Saint Helen. Stewardship refers to caring for the people and other resources that God has created. In other words, it's caring for something on God's behalf because the act of caring enriches our lives.

The four pillars of stewardship are Hospitality, Prayer, Formation, and Service. These pillars are seen as the key areas for our faith community to live out a life of stewardship, which involves recognizing all gifts as coming from God and responding with gratitude by sharing one's time, talent, and treasure.

I feel we are very much focused on hospitably and being a welcoming and kind community, both within the parish and to those who are new or in need. We focus on prayer as we nurture a relationship with God through personal, family, and communal prayer. We have many ministries focused on formation including continuous

learning, growth, and conversion, which involves deepening one's understanding of faith and stewardship. And finally, we use our service ministries to take action to help others less fortunate than ourselves and putting one's faith into practice by using individual gifts to help others and the wider community

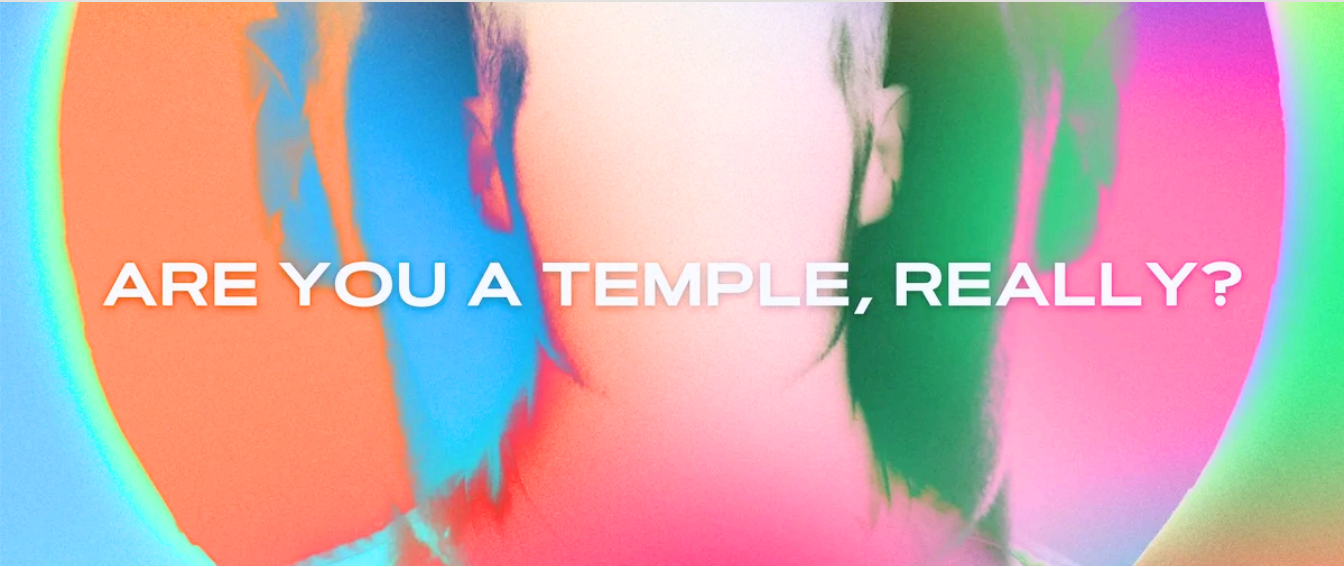

The Heritage Fund

The Heritage Fund is a restricted fund account established to allow parishioners and others to make donations or bequests that fund parish needs, improvements and programs.

We request that support of the Heritage Fund is in addition to a parishioner's regular weekly offertory gift. The ability to donate restricted funds has always existed but it is now being brought in under the banner of the Heritage Fund and a concerted effort is being made to make everyone more aware of the opportunity to support the parish in different and varied ways.

Information on the Heritage Fund is available here and will include a list of items currently under consideration for funding. This listing will be a fluid one that adds to it as needs present or demand. It will also provide the status of items currently being funded and indicate the successful completion of others.

As the name indicates, these funds can only be used for the intended purpose for which they are designated. They are not considered ordinary income like the Sunday and holiday collections. These funds are not intended to replace weekly giving, or any future decision for a capital campaign for major parish projects.

The donor must specify the item(s) or program(s) where they want the funds to be used. If you do not know to what item you would like to direct your gift, the pastor is willing to offer direction.

Donations can be made at any time by utilizing the “Heritage Fund” link on the parish website (sainthelen.org/heritage) and payment can be made by credit card, check, stock redemption or cash. For estate planning purposes it is recommended that a bequest specifying a dollar amount or percentage of estate value naming “Saint Helen Heritage Fund” be made in a will.
